


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INTRODUCTION:

Recapturing the Christian Paradigm

The supernatural is the natural not yet understood."—Elbert Hubbard

THE BIGGEST FIGHT IN CHRISTENDOM HAS ALWAYS BEEN in the arena of biblical theology. The apostle Paul knew this, and therefore worked tirelessly to arm the church theologically to stand against the encroaching deceptions of the Adversary. He wasn't going to let those under his watch get "tossed to and fro" by "every wind of doctrine" being introduced by cunning and divisive men (Ephesians 4:11-14). He saw what dangers lied ahead of him—and us—and therefore expounded extensively on the subject of the spirit realm in an attempt to arm Christians with the revelations necessary to fight the most important fight they will ever face: spiritual warfare. He foresaw centuries ago that Christians would one day be in danger of losing the true biblical paradigm: the realization that there is a spiritual world right beneath our noses; that demons and angels aren't figments of our imagination, but are real entities; and that the supernatural does exist. Paul mentioned in Ephesians 6:12 that we're not embroiled in a battle against "flesh and blood" (humans), but against supernatural entities: spirits and fallen angels; or as the late great theologian, Dr. Derrick Prince would say, "Personalities without bodies.'

Initially, Paul wasn't interested in the spirit world. He was content as an intellectual idolater and connoisseur of empty religious rituals: he was a Pharisee; and as a side job, he was a religious bounty hunter commissioned to hunt and kill Christians. But one day Paul had an encounter that changed his life. He had an encounter with the one he once thought of as simply a heretic promoted by 12 delusional men: he encountered Jesus while traveling on the Damascus Road. This was not a dream. Christ physically appeared before Paul, adorned in radiant glory, and then knocked him off of his

horse. This encounter left Paul visually impaired, physically injured, and startled on the side of the road for three days; but following this encounter, he was never the same. This type of event can transform any person from a nominal Christian—who is merely religious—to a genuine follower of Christ—who is panting after a more intimate relationship with God. But this type of event can have a dangerous side also. Remember: Satan can appear as an angel of light.

If you closely examine the world's religions, both past and present, you will discover that they're all birthed on the premise of a supernatural encounter. For example, the Hopi Native Americans talk about the Kachinas, spirit beings who descended from above to teach them civilization; the Dogons of West Africa talk about the Nommos, who they describe as spirit beings who came from a planet which orbits another star in the Sirius B star system; the ancient Egyptians claimed their original Pharaohs were celestial beings who descended from the stars; the Sumerians, one of the most scientifically, technologically, and socially sophisticated civilizations in the ancient world, claimed they were taught civilization from celestial beings they called the Annunaki (those who from heaven to earth came). In 610 A.D., an illiterate merchant and shepherd named Mohammed claimed he was visited by a celestial being who identified himself as the archangel Gabriel, and who dictated to him the Qu'ran. A similar case involves another illiterate man named Joseph Smith: he claimed he was visited one day while walking through the woods by two celestial beings who identified themselves as The Father and The Son. They told him the church was walking in error, and that he had been selected by God to introduce the true way of salvation. In another account, Smith claimed an angel who identified himself as Moroni, which gave him revelations from God on golden tablets, visited him. Joseph Smith is the founder of the Mormon Church. An occultist named L. Ron Hubbard, who practiced magic with a man named Jack Parsons, a rocket expert who claimed to have met a celestial entity in the Mojave Desert which identified itself as a Venusian (a being from the planet Venus) in 1945, founded the Church of Scientology based on the belief that extraterrestrials guide the affairs of men. Hubbard talked extensively about an alien named Xenu, which he claimed was the supreme ruler of an alien confederacy and who visited earth 75 million years ago. While sitting in a prison cell, a bright young African-American male who later became known as Malcolm X, converted to the Nation of Islam after he reportedly received a visit from a "smallish man with light skin and faintly Eurasian features" who "stayed for a time" and

then "vanished...without having spoken a word" (Peter L. Goldman, *The Death and Life of Malcolm X*, pg. 35).

Whether you think these experiences are real or not is irrelevant. What matters is that they are real to the individuals who shared them, and that they are at the core of every major religious movement in history. Even today, experiences like these continue to be reported. And in case this doesn't trouble you or you think this is just a fad that will quickly vanish, let me remind you that the same was said about Judaism and Christianity: they both started out small in numbers, were derided and discredited by the intellectuals of their day, and consisted of a person or persons who professed to be in communication with a supernatural entity or entities.

It is embarrassing to witness Christians scoff at individuals who make such claims and join in with the atheistic chorale in declaring them to be a bunch of "nuts" and "fantasy-prone personalities" while forgetting that Christianity began the same way. If you were to view Christianity through the eyes of a skeptic, you would probably call this absurd: Abraham, the father of the Jewish and Christian faiths, heard a voice calling out to him from nowhere, telling him to leave his home and go to another land. (He'd be called a contactee by UFOlogists today.) One day, an eighty-yearold man named Moses had a conversation with a burning bush that ordered him to go to Egypt and wrench the Israelite slaves from the hands of the most powerful man on earth...with a stick that could turn into a snake when thrown down and turn water into blood. A teenage girl named Mary was mysteriously impregnated by a spirit being with a fetus that was not of this world, one that was both mortal and divine—in technical terms, a hybrid. And speaking of Jesus: everyday of His life He remained in constant communication with an invisible entity He called "Father". Jesus even encountered a celestial entity in the Judean wilderness which physically lifted Him onto a high plateau and showed Him a vision of all of the nations of the world with the promise of making Him their ruler if He would bow before him (Matt 4:1-11). These stories sound silly to nonbelievers; and yet, they're at the core of the Christian faith.

The Bible claims supernatural encounters occur on a regular basis. You might walk pass a supernatural being on the streets, in the mall or in the grocery store, completely oblivious of the fact that they are of...none earthly origins. We encounter both good and malignant nonhumans. But I fear that we may begin to experience an increase in visitations from malignant nonhumans (fallen angels) as Christ's return draws near. It therefore behooves us to revisit those

legends, myths and promises passed down by the ancients regarding the return of their gods, and handle more delicately and scrutinize more earnestly the claims of supernatural visitations currently being reported—either this or we denounce the premise of the Jewish and Christian faiths.

Are you prepared to fight a fallen angel? You must first believe in the devil before you can confront him. Many today, according to surveys, believe in neither Satan nor the Holy Spirit. They've fallen into the trap of the naturalistic, materialistic paradigm which claims that only that which is empirical, physical, tangible is real; and yet, even scientists today aren't so sure about this. They are pushing the boundaries of what is considered normal and exploring possibilities once considered to be the work of science fiction: parallel universes, time-travel, chimeras, Artificial Intelligence, alternate dimensions, life on other planets, etc. They're becoming more supernaturally inclined than most Christians.

While science marches forward into the dark forest of the unknown, many Christians remain stuck in the quicksand of senseless debates—discrepancies rooted in traditions derived from misinterpretations of Scripture passed down by individuals too proud to admit they erred. So, now it's a struggle just to get so-called Believers to...believe...in the validity of the Bible. When Satan does strike, Christians will be meandering in the dark without the answers to the emerging questions of the day, and will be considered irrelevant in the minds of those searching for *an* explanation.

Much of the church lacks discernment today. Some church -goers are sinking in philosophical quicksand, trying to turn Jesus into a social activist rather than the Savior; or fuse, as the Nazis did, Christianity with Nationalism and/or Environmentalism; or make the gospel more appealing to a sin-sick world by compromising on key positions. Many have succumb to the Marxist ideology of Political Correctness, which is designed to gag the truth. They now declare "I can't judge" despite being commissioned by God to "judge all things" (I Cor 2:15, 6:1-3). Opting out of their responsibility to acknowledge sin and engage the sinner, they've ignored Ezekiel 3:17-21 and Romans 10:14, which says it is our job to speak against sin.

There is a theological attack being waged against Christianity; Paul said there would be. In 1 Timothy 4:1, he said there would be an influx of demons infiltrating the church, proclaiming a false gospel. Should there be any surprise that the world's most notorious schemer would engage in espionage and guerilla warfare when attacking Christians? Satan has an agenda, and when we finally realize

this we'll be able to identify the wolves in sheep's clothing gracing pulpits across the globe and discern the direction every world event is taking us in; and we'll then discover how they are all connected to

Satan's big plan. Step back and look at the big picture.

Understanding this, I now see world events differently. For example, since the Bible tells us that Satan will create a one-world government led by he and his antichrist, I know that the events which have led us to our present economic and social crises are not accidents. This may come as a shock to some, but much of what has been and is being regarded as conspiracy theory does contain many kernels of truth. For example, take the conspiracy theory of a shadow government orchestrating world events from behind the scenes: this is not a theory; it is a documented fact. History is replete with instances of small groups who conspired in secrecy in order to seize enormous amounts of power which they used to change or control governments. We know about how conspirators took control of the Soviet Union during the Bolshevik Revolution under Lenin, China during the Chinese Revolution under Mao, Cuba during the Cuban Revolution under Castro, Iraq under Saddam, France during the French Revolution, and celebrate the colonists who conspired in the dark to free America from the British during the American Revolution. So you don't have to be a Rhodes Scholar to see that every major movement in history started with a few people conspiring in the dark. And it is asinine to think there are no communists, socialists, jihadists, Dominionists; despisers of free enterprise, capitalism, and liberty; or angry, bitter, paranoid control-freaks currently conspiring against America...especially within its borders. That just goes against commonsense. Of course we have enemies in high places... internally. That's what most of America's early leaders—like Abraham Lincoln—spent much of their time fighting against.

America is not a piece of land; it's an ideology which exalts Christian principles and liberty; it is therefore incumbent upon us to realize that the fight to preserve these things isn't fought and won on the battlefields but in the classrooms, sanctuaries, and over the airwaves. Satan's goal is to reign over the airwaves and inject spiritual illiteracy into society through academia. It is a must that we be able to identify Satan's handywork even if only to prevent ourselves and those we love from perishing along with the deceived masses.

The flesh is Satan's playground. This is why God warns us not to trust in *flesh*—which the apostle Paul described as containing "no good thing" therein, and the prophet Jeremiah referred to as "desperately wicked" and unknowable. History has repeatedly prov-

en to us that human nature is unpredictable, and those who overlook its propensity for evil often become its victims. Man can easily be corrupted by power. Even those with good intentions (who don't think they're evil as Proverbs 16:2 declares) unknowingly become Satan's "useful idiots" (a term coined by the socialist revolutionary, Vladimir Lenin, describing individuals who, because of their gullibility, can easily be used to promote an agenda—and after they have outworn their use, they're to be discarded) when not submitted to God and His word. Our intellect is no match for Satan.

I discovered pretty early in my life that Satan is real and that he has an agenda to kill, steal and destroy. At the age of eleven I began experiencing nightmares and hallucinations after a period of feasting nightly on nothing but gratuitous, graphic and highly stylized violence (Nightmare on Elmstreet, Halloween, Friday the 13th, etc.). These movies didn't scare me, but they did effect me on a spiritual level. It wasn't long before I began having nightmares and hallucinations of spiders. I met with a psychiatrist, took medications, languished through boring dialogues—listening to the same useless logical explanations—but nothing worked. My condition worsened. This went on for months. Then, one day, I went to hear my oldest brother (the late Rev. Aric Bernard Flemming, Sr.) preach. The title of his sermon was "Caught-up in a Spider's Web". He boldly proclaimed that Satan can and will trap you through sin, making it impossible for you to get free; but when you find yourself trapped like a fly in a spider's web, just call on the name of Jesus, plead His blood over your life, and God will deliver you. That morning I went down to the altar during the altar call; and that afternoon, when I got home, I followed his advice and asked Jesus to deliver me from the bondage I was in and began pleading the blood of Jesus over my mind. INSTANTLY I was delivered. The nightmares and hallucinations ceased. Years later, while studying spiritual warfare at a Bible college, I came across references to demons shaped like arachnids, snakes, frogs, and locusts. At this point it became clear to me that what I dealt with as a child was spiritual (demonic) in nature. Demons enter into our lives through doorways we provide for them through television, music, occult activities and objects, sin and spiritual ignorance; and once in, they bring torment (1 John 4:18).

When you know what is really going on and why, you are better prepared to face whatever challenges await you. This is why Paul said, "...so that Satan will not outsmart us. For we are familiar with his evil schemes" (2 Cor 2:11, *New Living Translation*). He also wrote, "so I fight, not as one that beateth the air" (1 Cor 9:26, KJV).

He knew who the real enemy is, what his tactics are, and what he had to do to defeat him.

In the first five chapters, I'll cover Satan's activities in society—in academia, religion, and politics. We'll examine direct quotes and occurrences that prove there is a conspiracy being carried out in Washington and the rest of the world which is aimed at destroying Christianity's influence and establishing the kingdom of Satan and his antichrist on earth. We'll hear it from the horses' mouths.

Concerning the last four chapters, buckle your seatbelt because it's going to be a bizarre ride. There, I'll address what I believe to be the great delusion that will come upon the earth just before Christ's return. In these final chapters I'll be dealing exclusively and extensively with the activities of super-intelligences (fallen angels), examining their tactics in the past as well as what they have planned for our future. Again, we'll examine the quotes given by top occultists and Satanists revealing Satan's game-plan for the end-times as it was revealed to them by the powers and principalities they unwittingly serve. You will discover how this deception has been in the making for thousands of years, and how man has and is being conditioned to believe it when it comes. Satan is a supernatural being who uses both the natural and the supernatural; therefore, we must prepare for both and accept the possibility of things which are hard to accept (but should be easy for one who understands the reality of a higher realm where supernatural beings dwell and operate, which the Bible repeatedly stresses to us).

As God sweeps the world with the gospel through the use of miracles, signs and wonders, the great imitator (Satan), certainly not one to be outdone, is preparing to impersonate God; and if you don't know the truth, you'll believe the lie and fall for the counterfeit when *he* comes. Let's get started!
